Birgit Fischer, Germany, is the Chairwoman at the University Council of the Ruhr University Bochum and a consultant in health industry and public health. Birgit Fischer is the Former Minister of Health and Social Affairs in North-Rhein-Westphalia and the former Director General of the Association of Research-Based Pharmaceutical Companies in Berlin (Verband Forschender Arzneimittelhersteller VfA) and the former CEO of a health insurance company in Germany.

Clayton Heijman, The Netherlands, is the founder and a Director of Privium Fund Management. After working for Kas-Bank and merchant bank MeesPierson, he joined Goldman Sachs as an executive director in the Equity Finance & Prime Brokerage division from 1994. In 1998 he joined Fortis as a Managing Director to set up the Prime Fund Solutions activities. After leaving in 2006 he worked as a Managing Director at Credit Agricole-Calyon before setting out on his own. In 2008, he started Privium, a firm that provides support to investment management initiatives and now has 30+ teams worldwide and Darwin Platform, a firm that provides middle office services. In 2014, he started an initiative to facilitate early translational developments together with EATRIS and industry specialists. This program facilitates the combination of health organisations, developers and impact investors. Clayton Heijman obtained a degree from the Dutch H.E.A.O. in Utrecht in 1983 and a Master in Business Administration from Webster University in Leiden in 1986, with an emphasis in marketing and management.

Ivett Jakab, Hungary, is the President of the European Patients' Forum (EPF) Youth Group, aiming to strengthen the young patients' voice throughout Europe. She is working as a health economics researcher, leading the Patient Policy Research Unit at Syreon Research Institute, an independent private research institute based in Budapest, Hungary. She was a selected member of the European Health Parliament program's Value and Innovation Committee in 2018. She has joined the EUPATI Course as a trainee in 2019.

Jytte Lyngvig, Denmark, currently works as a Senior consultant with assignments for WHO and others. She has been the Senior Vice President and Managing Director for DIA Europe, Middle East & Africa based in Basel, Switzerland and the CEO of the Danish Medicines Agency from 2000 to 2012.
